Headline Data:

2 hours Participation in PE & School Sport at KS4 has increased from 35% in 2004/5 to 42% in 2009/10

Participation in Intra-School Competition at The Manor has increased from 5% in 2004/5 to 66% in 2009/10

Participation in Inter-School Competition has increased at The Grove Primary School from 36% at KS2 in 2004/5 to 100% at KS1 & 2 in 2009/10

KEY SUCCESSES

OSHL Opportunities:

At Manor: In 2009/10 there were OSHL clubs in Dance Mats (Breakfast club on 2 mornings a week with 15 pupils from Yrs 7 – 11), Self-defence (9 pupils from Yrs 7 – 11), Trampolining (13 pupils from Yrs 7 & 8), Aerobics (17 pupils from Yrs 7 – 11), SIN Cru dance performance group (9 pupils from Yrs 7 – 9), Rugby (9 pupils from Yrs 7 & 8 boys and girls), Boys football (16 pupils from yrs 7 & 8).

At the Primary Schools there has been an increased range of OSHL clubs run by teachers/TAs who have attended training (e.g. multiskills and tennis at Shirley, activ8, football and cricket at Grove, multiskills and hockey at King's Hedges) as well as Partnership coaches running clubs (e.g. dance at Shirley and King's Hedges, athletics, cricket and hockey at King's Hedges, gymnastics at Shirley, multiskills and basketball at Grove).

Inter Competition:

At Manor: The range of inter-school competitions has increased to include Football (county cup semi-final) – 72 boys from Yrs 7 – 11; Athletics - 18 boys and girls from Yrs 7 & 9; Badminton – 8 boys and girls from Yrs 8 & 9; Cricket – 10 boys from Yr 8; Dodgeball – 16 boys from Yrs 8 & 11; Rounders – 11 girls from Yrs 7 & 9.

At the Primary Schools: There has been an established programme of festivals for Yrs 1 – 5 which involve all pupils and an expanding programme of Partnership competitions for selected teams in Yr 6. 65% of pupils at Shirley have taken part in inter-school competition in 2009/10 compared with 55% in 2008/9 and 87% of pupils at King's Hedges have taken part in inter-school competition in 2009/10 compared with 71% in 2008/9.

Leadership & Volunteering Programme:

28 leaders from Yr 8, 19 leaders from Yr 9 and 16 from Yr 10 were trained to deliver activities at sports festivals with Primary School pupils.

Two Yr 10 pupils were selected to be Young Ambassadors who prepared an assembly to promote the 2012 Olympics and Paralympics and delivered an athletics festival at a Primary School.

Grove has an established programme for training and deploying Yrs 5 & 6 leaders within the curriculum. In 2009/10 King's Hedges trained all Yr 5 pupils and deployed them in a structured programme of lunchtime activities. Orchard Park trained all pupils in Yrs 4, 5 & 6.
